<u>Assignment – Colour Scheme for your condo</u>

- 1. Create a colour board for your entire condo. *All the rooms can be shown on one board*, but samples should be grouped as rooms. Place the board in the same position as the rooms in the condo.
- 2. <u>Label each colour sample</u>.
- 3. Remember to have some transition between rooms. This may be achieved by repeating some of the colours, or by using similar tones, shades, or intensities.
- 4. Be aware of the client you are working with. What mood are you trying to achieve? Review your notes on the psychological effects of colour so you incorporate appropriate colours.

5. Include:

- Wall (paint, paneling, wallpaper, fabric)
- Floor (carpet, wood, tile, vinyl, slate)
- Counters kitchen and bathroom
- Window coverings (fabric, blinds)
- Upholstery and bedding
- Furniture and shelving (wood, metal)
- Accents
- Appliances and fixtures (you may use paint or arborite samples to indicate the colours)
